How can you guard yourself from being a “lukewarm” Christian? How can you regularly evaluate your spiritual condition?

How have you been able to see that Jesus’ words are trustworthy in your life?

Have you ever been mistaken or deceived about your spiritual condition or maturity? How did you come to learn of your mistake?

What is the proper response when the Lord exposes sin and spiritual immaturity or disobedience in your life?

Why is discipline actually a sign of love? How does this conflict with the conception of love in contemporary culture?

What types of things does Jesus criticize these local churches for?
